Logistical Coordinator

ONE

Individual with a minimum of one-year overnight camp experience, preferably within an Orthodox Christian setting. Reports directly to the Camp Director and is responsible for the day-to-day operation of the camp, keeping the entire camp on schedule, mediates concerns from the Cabin Staff, Arts & Crafts Leaders, Music Coordinator, and Waterfront Personnel. This team member will also oversee the registration process on arrival and departure days. Individuals should be practicing Orthodox Christians, active in their local parish, and have the recommendation of their parish priest.

- Minimum Age of 21, but maturity will be a factor in selection

Cabin Staff

TWELVE (6 male & 6 female)

Individuals are paired with a co-counselor and supervise a maximum of 16 young people their same sex. Cabin Staff are responsible for their campers 24-hours per day, leading them to various activities, overseeing daily cabin clean-up, and monitoring behavior. They may also lead discussions, coordinate evening and athletic events, as well as supervise small and large groups within the program.

- Adults with a minimum of one-year post high school experience are encouraged to apply.

Waterfront Personnel

TWO

These individual must be lifeguard certified, including CPR certification, and have experience in a large pool or lake setting. They will oversee Daily Swim & Canoe Time for each of the cabins, as well as the Camp-Wide Swim. At the beginning of camp, they will conduct a Swim Test for all campers. During non-swim time, these staff members will assist with evening activity set-up, providing breaks for the cabin staff, worship, and other duties as assigned by the Camp Director.

- Minimum Age of 19. Waterfront Personnel do not have to be Orthodox Christians, however preferable.

Arts & Crafts Leaders

TWO

A love for youth, a willingness to get your hands dirty, an affinity to tie-dye, & a creative approach to our faith are needed for this position. These leaders run our Art Barn for the week, including set-up and clean-up. They also serve as support for our Logistical Coordinator or Director and may be asked to assist the Cabin Staff, Utility Staff and also help with evening activities.

Ropes Course Leaders

TWO

These members oversee the Ropes Course portion of our Camp Curriculum. They should be athletically inclined, familiar with the intricacies of a ropes environment, be faithful Orthodox Christians, and be willing to complete a competency course prior to the start of Camp.

- Minimum Age of 20
- Certification and training will be offered to the Ropes Course Leaders prior to camp

Medical Staff

ONE

Nurses, physicians, EMTs, and PAs with a love for young people and the outdoors are encouraged to apply. The role of our medical staff is an important one, helping to keep all of our campers safe and healthy throughout the week. Individuals are "on-call" 24 hours a day, and spend much of their time dispensing medicine, comforting homesick youth, and attending to bug bites, bee stings, and sprained ligaments. Medical personnel will also present a brief safety training during orientation and are responsible for the individual medical packs worn by our cabin staff.

Music Makers

ONE

This individual must have a love of music, a good understanding of Orthodox liturgical music, and the ability to lead teens in learning and appreciating all types of music. Aside from the scheduled music sessions, our Music Maker will be responsible for all daily worship services, our evening music event, and the Talent Show. Our goal is that all youth will learn about our rich musical heritage and develop an appreciation for liturgical chant, while actively participating in the services during the week.

Utility Staff

TWO

These individuals will keep the camp running providing support to all of our assignment specific team members. Whether it's a last minute run to the store, driving an injured camper to the doctor, helping to fill water balloons, setting up supplies for an evening outing, these folks will be kept busy. Ability to work under pressure, ease to multi-task, carpentry or wood working skills, and a desire to work with all types of people are several of the key skills need for this position

- Minimum Age of 24, but maturity will be a factor in selection
